Hea Yoon's favorite part about America is that stores are open on Sundays and iPods are cheaper. She plans on getting an iPod while here. Another big plan for her is going to Disney World. The biggest differences being here, for her, are transportation, the driving age, and the school systems.

Alejandra Testa Pison is from Buenos Aires, Argentina, and is currently staying with the Brown family. She got involved in the program because her uncle was a foreign exchange student and she thought that it was interesting. So far she likes America but doesn't like the food. Her favorite part about America is how organized it is here.

Rock Creek Receives National Honor

Rock Creek Junior/Senior High School has been named a Blue Ribbon School by the U.S. Department of Education. The award was announced at a news conference on September 15 by U.S. Secretary of Education, Arne Duncan. Rock Creek was one of five Kansas schools and the only Kansas secondary school to receive the award. The Blue Ribbon Award is considered the highest honor an American school can achieve.

Blue Ribbon Schools must be nominated by their state's education department for excellence in student achievement. Nominated schools can be public or private schools that are either academically superior, or have dramatically improved achievement among minority and disadvantaged students. Last year, Rock Creek was nominated by the Kansas Department of Education for high academic achievement and was the only Kansas secondary school nominated.

Principal Dennis Post and Title I teacher Jeremy Lehning will attend the Blue Ribbon Award ceremony in Washington, D.C. on November 3, 2009. They will be presented with a plaque and a blue flag which will fly on the school's flag pole in recognition of Rock Creek as one of the top schools in the nation. A ceremony for the flag-raising will take place at Rock Creek on November 6, 2009, at 1:30 p.m. Congratulations to the faculty, staff, and students of Rock Creek Junior/Senior High School for this amazing accomplishment!

Roberts Places Fifth at Nationals

On May 23 and 24 the Rock Creek Debate and Forensics Students competed in a national speech competition in Albany, New York. Nine students from Rock Creek participated, including Torrey Peterson and Sam Cott in Policy Debate, Ben Peterson and Mandi Blenn in Policy Debate, Jeran Fry and Brenda Stevenson in Lincoln/Douglas Debate, Nolan Fike and Morgan Eichman in Duo Interpretation (basically, duet acting), and T.J. Roberts in OIL (Oral Interpretation of Literature.)

While all the students did fairly well, one student stands out. T.J. Roberts became our first Rock Creek student ever to make the final round at the national tournament, bringing home 5th place. T.J. beat hundreds of students from across the country. His event, OIL, combines the two events T.J. won at the state tournament in Wichita; poetry and prose. In OIL, the students alternate between the two. Round one T.J. did poetry, round two he did prose, and so on. T.J. made it through eight rounds of competition to earn his trophy.

"The students were so excited for TJ. They were bouncing off the walls," said Coach Keith Miller. "It was a really fun trip. The students were wonderful to travel with. They were positive, helpful, and considerate. I couldn't ask for a better group of students. Plus, we learned so much from watching the other competitors, and we came home with over 40 titles of pieces to get for next year."

The tournament, known by the abbreviation CFL, for Catholic Forensics League, started in 1951. This year was the largest national tournament ever. Although it is run by Catholic Schools and is associated with the Catholic Church, one does not have to be Catholic to participate. Next year's national tournament will be held in Omaha, Nebraska.


