Business Department Career Pathway

As required by the Kansas State Department of Education, the business department is creating new classes as part of the state's Career Pathways curriculum restructuring. This curriculum requires the school to choose a career pathway from a list of career clusters and develop classes at three levels: introductory, technical, and application. Our introductory level course will be Computer Applications; the technical level courses include Web Page Design, Computer Programming and Digital Graphic Design; and the application level class will be Design Technology which is a combination of computer animation and video production skills. The classes developed at the technical and application levels receive additional state funding which is critical to the success of our schools and our students.

Along with curriculum, we need to find new advisory council members with job experience in the new career pathway. Our business department is in the process of applying for the Career Pathways program and developing the required curriculum and competencies and is in need of Advisory council members who meet the digital design qualifications. These members must be employed in the business/industry of the chosen pathway and represent the local labor market.
