#### School Supplies Needed for Chapter Project

Have you ever wondered what it would be like to not have school supplies to use to get an education? It is hard for most of us to imagine. Gary LaGrange of Manhattan is trying to do something about children around the world who don't have supplies to use when attending school, if they are lucky enough to have teachers. Mr. LaGrange had a life-altering experience while serving in Vietnam. During his tour of duty in the late '60s, he met with a village chief who expressed a need for school supplies. Mr. LaGrange contacted his wife and pastor back in the United States to see if they could help in some way. They worked together and sent 4,000 pounds of school supplies for Vietnamese children. As a result, the village people started trusting the soldiers and many good things started to happen.

To make a long story short, Mr. LaGrange is still offering his help around the world. As a result he received the National Senior Corps Award for his efforts in "Help us Learn. Give us Hope" foundation that he founded. More than 300,000 children have received help through the organization. This year the junior high FCCLA chapter members are going to support his efforts by collecting school supplies and raising money to help pay for shipping of the supplies as their chapter project. To kick off the project, Mr. LaGrange talked to the students on December 13, 2010, to discuss his experience and how Americans can help support this project. #### Winter Driving

There are many ways to handle dangerous winter weather. Staying home to stay safe is the first choice, but sometimes travel is necessary. Pay attention to the weatherman and the warnings so you will be prepared. If the forecast is for cold, wind, ice, snow, sleet, or freezing rain, beware of driving in this type of weather. Here are some winter driving tips you may use.

- Find out about road conditions before you go.
- Remove snow and ice from vehicle before you start. It is
  important to see as well as be seen, so be sure to clean
  windows, turn signals, and brake lights.
- Buckle up before you set the vehicle in motion.
- Leave early so you have extra time wherever you are traveling.
- Slow down for wet, snowy, and icy conditions.
- Do not slam on brakes; pump gently and come to a slow stop.
- Avoid quick acceleration
- Never use cruise control in winter weather conditions.

- Blankets or sleeping bags
- Non-perishable foods
- Water
- Can opener
- First aid kit
- Flashlight and batteries
- Simple tool kit
- Metal coffee cans
