Pumpkins Going Wild

Pumpkins were flying high on November 30 as the physics class at Rock Creek High School launched their full-sized pumpkin catapults. The class divided into six groups, each making a catapult that modeled either a trebuchet (counterweight) or a ballista (pull back and launch). One group ventured out to make a magonel which is similar to holding a spoon with one hand and pulling it back and launching it with the other. The goal of the exercise was to launch a pumpkin at least 10 meters. Two of the groups sailed a pumpkin to 57 meters which is about 123 feet.

This is the second of three engineering tasks that the students will complete this year. The tasks are designed for the students to employ the principles of designing, building, testing, and then redesigning. Given a month to complete the catapults, the hope is that they were built, tested, and then adjusted to perform better prior to the launch date. The task definitely got the students thinking and working outside of their normal high school curriculum.
