Exit Project Raises \$ for Autistic Students

Chelsea Renner's exit project was twofold. She wanted to learn photography and she wanted to raise money to help the autistic students at Rock Creek Junior/Senior High School. Chelsea met with her mentor, Ali Mocabee, owner of Ali Mocabee Designs, and learned the basics of a Canon digital camera and photo editing using PhotoShop. With this knowledge, she went on to take several hundred pictures over the course of several months. Chelsea submitted pictures to the Riley County and Pottawatomie County fairs and received feedback on the quality of her picture taking and editing.

Next, Chelsea chose 12 pictures to edit and display in the Poppyfield Gallery owned by Britt Nichols and located in the Vin Vivante Winery in Wamego, Kansas. The pictures were viewed by the public and offered for sale to raise money for autistic students in the Rock Creek school district. Chelsea sold several of her photographs and earned \$125. On December 7, Chelsea presented the money to Mrs. Morgan Milham and Mrs. Tori Sieben, of the Rock Creek Special Education Department. Mrs. Milham said, "The money will be put to good use; we will buy games that will help our autistic students with their social skills."

With the number three seed heading into tournament play, the Rock Creek 8th grade girls' basketball season was drawing to a close on Saturday, December 11, 2010. To start the day off right, the Mustangs began by taking on the number six seed Riley County Falcons. Though they had beaten the Falcons twice in the regular season, RCJH knew the road ahead was going to be tough. The Mustangs jumped ahead with the lead and ended the first six minutes with a 14-2 lead. During the 2nd quarter, the Lady Stangs kept up their good defense and went into the break with a 22-5 lead. After the midgame break, RC maintained their control of the game and finished it off 42-15. Leading the effort for the Mustangs in points was *Blair Campbell* with 12 and *Alexis Wilson* with 8.

To continue pool play, the Mustangs took on Silver Lake whom the Lady Stangs had never defeated, though both games had been close. RCJH started the game off with a bang, ready to get the lead. Also, they played very tough defense allowing only 4 points in the first half compared to their 14 scored against the Eagles. Though the Mustangs went into a slight slump during the third quarter, they quickly recovered and added onto their lead, starting the final six minutes of play up 20-10. The Mustangs were ready to finally defeat the Eagles. This showed as they pulled out the win 24-14, triumphantly. The Lady Stangs would head back to the championship game for the second year in a row.

The championship game was bittersweet in many ways for the Mustangs as they took on the undefeated St. Marys Bears. Both teams were ready for the rematch of last year's championship. The game began in favor of the Mustangs as they got the tipoff and went down to play some offense. Ending with some quick points by St. Marys, the first half flew by quickly with the score at the break 15-10, Mustangs trailing. During the second half, RCJH played hard but just couldn't get over the point deficit and ended the game behind 34-27. "We came in with a plan, we executed the plan, but just didn't score enough points to win," said Coach Lehning. "I am proud of the improvement we made as a team and all of the girls made as individuals. I can't wait to see the steps they make in the next four years and, for some, maybe even more years after that." The Mustangs points came from Alexis Wilson, Blair Campbell, Shannon Caffrey and Sarah Altenhofen with 10, 10, 2 and 5 respectively. The Mustangs finished their season with a record of 9-6 and 8-5 in the Mid-East League and with their respectable 2nd place medals.
