2011-2012 ACT Test Dates

Rock Creek Achieves Standard of Excellence State Assessments

Each year, Kansas school students in grades 3-8 and one grade in high school are required to take a state test in math and reading as well as other exams. The results of these tests determine school and district accreditation. The primary goal is to achieve Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP), which requires an increasing percentage of students to score in the top three of five performance categories. If test results are very high, test results may achieve the state's Standard of Excellence, which requires many students to score in the top category of "Exemplary" and very few students to score in the bottom category of "Academic Warning".

This past spring, our students took 26 assessments and achieved the state's Standard of Excellence on every test! The credit for this amazing achievement goes to our teachers, administrators, support staff, kids, parents, and school board members. We could not achieve these results without the support of our patrons as well because they help pay for the people, programs, facilities, and equipment we need to deliver such a high-quality service.

Emily Forge Benefit

A successful benefit meal and silent auction was held on October 15, 2011, for the Forge family at Rock Creek. Emily and her family have spent the past many months driving to Kansas City hospitals, while incurring many medical bills. FFA, StuCo, and FCCLA organized a benefit and silent auction. Blankets, cooking utensils, clothing, sports items, candles, beauty products, tanning products, games, children's items as well as other items were donated to the silent auction from high school organizations, 4-H clubs, elementary classes, elementary and high school staff, business, and community members. FFA and the Ag classes cooked a hog and scalloped potatoes meal. An estimated 250-300 people attended and \$10,256.50 was raised. 
