Rock Creek Earns Honors

Rock Creek Junior/Senior High School received the Governor's Achievement Award for scoring in the top 5% in both reading and mathematics assessments. Qualifying schools must achieve the Standard of Excellence in both Kansas state assessments. There were a total of 44 elementary schools, 12 middle/junior high schools, and 18 high schools recognized this year. The building principal received the award at the December 10 school board meeting.

Kansas State Department of Education has nominated Rock Creek Junior/Senior High School for participation in the national 2008-2009 No Child Left Behind – Blue Ribbon Schools Awards Program. This program honors elementary and secondary schools whose students achieve in the top 10 percent in the state on reading and mathematics assessments as well as those schools that have 40 percent of their students from disadvantaged backgrounds and have dramatically improved student performance. The Blue Ribbon Schools Program has set a high standard for the past 26 years. Five schools have been nominated from Kansas – four elementary schools and one high school. The final selection will be made in September 2009.

U.S. News & World Report has also named Rock Creek Junior/Senior High School in their second annual list of America's Best High Schools. Three categories of distinction are recognized – gold, silver, and bronze. Ratings are based on standardized test performance, proficiency rates of all students (including the least advantaged), and challenging college-ready curriculum. Rock Creek received a bronze medal which means the school met the first two criteria but not the third. Other schools in Kansas were named to this list. Debate News

The Rock Creek Debate Team has been successful of late, bringing home trophies from their last four meets. On November 6 the team went to Riley County High School and won first place overall. Debating for the Mustangs were *Justin Fronce* and *Jackie Gonzalez* who went 3-1 and finished sixth, *Ben Peterson* and *Mandi Blenn* who went 4-0 and finished first, *Amy Eshelman* and *Cody Liming* who went 2-2, *Skylar Myers* and *Josh Lohse* who went 2-2, and *Lane Frazier* and *Brenda Stevenson* who went 2-2.

Two days later the team went to Clay Center and won first place again. Sam Cott and Torrey Peterson went 4-0 and finished first, Jackie Gonzalez and Justin Fronce went 4-0 and finished second, and Ben Peterson and Mandi Blenn went 4-0 and finished third. Also debating for the Mustangs were Jeran Fry and Brenda Stevenson who went 2-2, and Lane Frazier and Josh Lohse who went 2-2.

After taking a weekend off to put on the fall play, the students were back at it. Rock Creek hosted a debate tournament on November 22 and also sent some students to the Salina South High School Junior Varsity Tournament. Rock Creek finished second out of 21 schools at Salina South. Luke Goodenow and Alyssa Donoho went 5-0 and finished fourth out of 60 teams. Ben Peterson and Mandi Blenn went 4-1, Jackie Gonzalez and Justin Fronce went 3-2, and Jeran Fry and Brenda Stevenson went 3-2. The school that won the tournament, Buhler High School, only had two losses on the day. Both of Buhler's losses were to Rock Creek.

The debate team also went to Concordia High School. The team brought home the first place trophy for the second year in a row. In the open division *Ben Peterson* and *Mandi Blenn* were 4-1 and finished third while *Alyssa Donoho* and *Jackie Gonzalez* went 3-2 and finished seventh, one place away from a medal. In the novice division *Lane Frazier* and *Jeran Fry* went 4-1 and finished fifth, while *Cody Liming* and *Skylar Myers* went 3-2.

The Rock Creek Debate Team competed at the National Catholic Forensics Debate Qualifying Tournament held at Marysville High School. The team did well, winning the first place sweepstakes trophy and qualifying two teams for the national tournament to be held in June. Qualifying for the Mustangs were *Sam Cott* and *Torrey Peterson*, who went 5-0 and finished in first place overall. *Mandi Blenn* and *Ben Peterson* went 4-1 and finished in fourth place. Falling just short of qualifying were *Luke Goodenow* and *Alyssa Donoho*, who finished seventh. "If they had won one more ballot, they would have qualified as well," said Coach Keith Miller.

The first place sweepstakes trophy was a first for Rock Creek who has never won a CFL qualifying tournament sweepstakes trophy before, in either debate or forensics. "We have five second place plaques and a third place plaque, but this is the only first place plaque for the school," said Coach Miller.

"It was certainly a total team effort," said Coach Miller. "In debate, the students who travel on any particular weekend rely on the research efforts of everyone, including those who stay behind. For example, this past week *Brenda Stevenson* found a great piece of evidence that *Sam* used on Saturday. Even though *Brenda* didn't travel, her efforts helped make it possible for those who did travel to succeed. This work ethic, this effort on everyone's part, has been the key to our success," summarized Coach Miller.

On Friday and Saturday, the team travels to Emporia High School to compete in the 4-Speaker Regional Tournament. The team will then have Winter Break off. The state meet is scheduled for January 23 and 24.
