# **How Other Countries Celebrate the Holidays**

There are many Christmas traditions around the world; you would be surprised by the differences between the United States and other countries.

For example, in the Czech Republic St. Nicholas aka Svaty Mikalas is believed to climb down to Earth from heaven on a golden rope along with his companions: an angel and a whip-carrying devil. Some young girls put a cherry twig in water on December 4, and if it blossoms, she will get married sometime during the year. At midnight most families go to Holy Mass or Pasterka.

Christmas preparations begin on December 6 in Germany; which is Nikolaustag or St. Nicholas Day. The Christmas tree originated in Germany and is a central focus of German celebrations.

In China the Christian children decorate Trees of Light or Christmas Trees with colorful ornaments made from paper. Santa Claus is called Dun Che Lao Ren, which means Christmas Old Man. The non-Christians call this season the Spring Festival. The children are the main focus, they receive new clothes and toys, eat, and watch firecracker displays.

Let's not forget Mexico, many Mexican families celebrate Las Posadas, which starts on December 16 and continues to December 25. This celebration is followed by gifts for the children and a celebration of foods.

The United States has many traditions as well. The use of Christmas trees, lights, ornaments, wreaths, candles and poinsettias to decorate is very popular. Many families buy gifts to exchange. Some families plan family meals to celebrate. Travel is likely as each family tries to keep in touch with others at this special time of year.

As you can see Christmas is not the same all around the world, but I think that is what makes each country's own celebration unique.

# **Winter Weather Driving**

There are many ways to handle dangerous weather. The main thing is to pay attention to the weatherman and the warnings. If they tell you the weather is very bad, try to stay inside as long as you can. Here are some winter driving tips you may take if you have to leave.

- Find out about driving conditions before you go.
- Remove snow and ice from vehicle to make sure you can be seen, especially around the turn signals, brake lights and windows.
- Buckle up before you set the vehicle in motion.
- Leave early so you have extra time wherever you are traveling.
- Slow down for wet, snowy and icy conditions.
- Do not slam on your brakes when you are driving.
- Avoid quick acceleration.
- Never use cruise control in winter weather conditions.
