Rock Creek Heroes

Friday, January 9, saw a whole new kind of heroes take the stage. During the Renaissance assembly, attendees saw a meeting of the "Justice League," or more precisely, several superheroes that resembled our own Rock Creek teachers. Present were Mole Girl, Mig Man (an intimidating guy with a welder), Groupie Girl, Spiderman, and the Underdog, who resembled Mr. Post.

The Underdog was sadly, ready to retire, so the Justice League earnestly summoned for a replacement. Some "superheroes" that came to the call were a rabbit that thought he was trying out for a cartoon - boy was he a hare out of place, a doctor, and a caveman who liked fire (but many students speculated he was Mr. Dugan in a costume). Not finding what they were looking for, the Justice League called on Rock Creek students to make their own hero. Each grade then got a "hero in a box" and dressed up as a hero. The winner was Laurel Lauer, I mean "Ballerina Girl," whose super power was to "superpower".

A similar assembly was held for the junior high with Mr. Harshbarger becoming Underdog and the addition of Cell Phone Girl and Word Girl. "Electricity" was chosen as the winner. She was a pretty super girl who was at one time Taylor Newman. A couple contests were presented, including superhero trivia - which the faculty dominated - and another game in which the winner proclaimed herself "Captain Underpants!"

A few other heroes recognized throughout the assembly were Brad Duncan, Nolan Fike, and Lucas Swoyer (just call them Lifesavers...but they don't come with a hole in the middle), as well as Jeri Brummett, for all that she does for Renaissance, and David Holliday, for being a great teacher and an amazing dad!

Road Conditions

Have you ever wondered why your road doesn't get cleaned very fast? Maybe your road is not a Category 1 road. Kansas Department of Transportation maintains about 10,000 miles of roads in Kansas. To use resources effectively and efficiently, KDOT must decide which roads are traveled the most frequently. KDOT then treats and plows the high priority roads the most often.

Category I roads are treated and plowed most frequently. They are multi-lane roads with over 3,000 vehicles daily.

Category II roads are treated and plowed frequently. They are two-lane roads with 1,000 to 3,000 vehicles daily.

Category III roads are treated and plowed less frequently. These are two-lane roads with less than 1,000 vehicles daily.
