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#### **Rock Creek Excels at State Debate**

The Rock Creek debate team sent nine students to Goddard High School to compete in the state four-speaker and two-speaker debate tournaments.

For the third year in a row, the team finished second at state in four-speaker debate. *Torrey Peterson, Sam Cott, Ben Peterson,* and *Mandi Blenn,* along with alternate *Justin Fronce,* finished with an 11-3 overall record. Only 26-time state champion Moundridge was better, with a 12-2 record. Rock Creek was responsible for both of the losses for Moundridge.

This tournament marked the end of the careers of *Torrey Peterson* and *Sam Cott*. They went out with a bang, finishing the tournament with a perfect 7-0 record, the only team at the tournament to do so. Fortunately, Rock Creek will have the team of *Mandi Blenn* and *Ben Peterson* back. The two second-year students joined the four-speaker team and did a great job of battling debate powers Sacred Heart and Moundridge.

Rock Creek also sent four freshmen to the two-speaker competition. *Jacob Miller, Shane Adams, Dylan Meyer,* and *Josh Roberts* debated for the Mustangs. *Dylan* and *Josh* made the out rounds, eventually falling to a pair of seniors from Lyons. *Dylan* and *Josh* took fourth place as freshmen. *Jacob* and *Shane* did not make the out rounds, but did beat the Lyons team in the first round.

# **Rock Creek Renaissance Pep Rally**


