2010 Senior Exit Projects

On March 12, the Rock Creek seniors completed their exit projects, a requirement for graduation. Their project started during the spring semester of their junior year in English class. They wrote an 8- to 10-page research paper on a topic of their choice. The students then completed a project that tied in with that research. Finally, they compiled a portfolio and gave a presentation on the entire project to their senior advisor, a faculty judge and their community mentor.

The community mentor is vital to the exit project. The process may seem difficult and overwhelming at times, but each senior chooses someone to guide them through and answer questions. This mentor may be a professional in the area, or simply someone who excels in a hobby and wants to share it with others. Students can choose from a variety of topics. The project can be career-oriented, service-oriented, or simply for personal growth. For instance, some of this year's seniors fixed motors, built furniture, raised money for important causes and completed home improvement projects.

Along with helping students learn about a topic they are interested in, the project forces students to develop important life skills. They must learn to communicate effectively with others, especially people with whom they are unfamiliar. In addition, students learn time management skills, since they must meet deadlines and coordinate their schedule with their mentors' schedules. Each year seniors say that the project teaches them about the problems of procrastination!

The Rock Creek faculty and staff are proud of the seniors and what they have accomplished. We hope you will join us at graduation when we will recognize several seniors whose projects were exceptional.
