

FCCLA Collecting Coupons

The Rock Creek FCCLA Junior High Chapter members are collecting coupons and reading material/books for their project "Support Our Troops." The chapter is calling on community members to help supply the items needed to send. Please send any coupons or reading material you collect to Rock Creek High School for mailing overseas to the troops.

Some Common Questions:

Where can I find coupons to send? Coupons can be found in just about any local newspaper and many magazines. They are on grocery store shelves, product packaging, the Internet or may come in your mailbox.

What kinds of coupons can they use overseas? Most manufacturer's coupons can be used. Exceptions include local geographical products such as your own local grocery store products. Coupons that are in high demand include baby products and skin care items. Coupons up to 6 months past their due date can be used by the military.

How should the coupons be packaged? All coupons should be cut neatly. Sort the coupons by category: food products, health and beauty items, baby items, pet items, non-food items. Zippered plastic sandwich bags are a great way to separate the coupons.

What coupons should I not include? Coupons nearing the 6-month expiration point, ripped coupons, and those with the expiration date cut off should not be sent. Do not send coupons that belong to a specific manufacturer only known in the U.S. or regional producers that do not distribute overseas.
